

**CHAHTA INCHUKKA** is a home-based parenting program that provides child development and parenting support to families with a Native child under the age of one through home-based parenting services.

**GUIDING ADOLESCENT PARENTS** is a home-based parenting program striving to ensure adolescent parents have resources and support needed to become successful and sustainable families.

**FATHERHOOD SERVICES** is a guidance program for young fathers looking to be the best dad they can be expecting or parenting a Choctaw eligible child.

**FAMILY PRESERVATION SERVICES** provides services designed to prevent family disruption and out-of-home placement by meeting the needs of a family in times of crisis.

**HEAD START** provides educational, health, nutritional, social and other services deemed necessary to promote school readiness in children aged 3-5 years.

**CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE** assists eligible low-income Native American families with financial obligations for childcare.

**CHILD CARE** provides care for children aged 6 weeks to 12 years. Child Care Centers are licensed through the Oklahoma Department of Human Services.

**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SERVICES (PROJECT EMPOWER)** that assists victims of domestic violence by helping them stabilize housing, childcare and other day-to-day support so they can focus on reclaiming their lives.

**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SERVICES (PROJECT HOUSE)** serves individuals in need of transitional housing assistance due to domestic violence situations.

**VICTIM ASSISTANCE** provides comprehensive services to victims of crime, including emergency food, clothing, shelter, safety planning, goal planning, counseling, court system advocacy and other victim advocacy services.

**CHAHTA HIMMITOA AIAHLI TOHNOCHI (CHAT)** seeks to prevent youth delinquency through mitigating mental health and substance abuse conditions by providing behavioral health counseling using techniques that are trauma focused and age appropriate.

**AHNI CENTER** Provides wrap around services for victims of child abuse, domestic violence and sexual assault including forensic interviews, advocacy, medical, therapy and appropriate referrals.

**CHOCTAW FOSTER CARE** recruits foster care resource homes to provide Choctaw children with safe, stable and nurturing homes that are culturally appropriate when they are removed from their homes.

**CHI HULLO LI** A residential treatment facility in Talihina that offers long term, comprehensive and culturally sensitive program for Native American women with or without children.

## ABOUT DDDR

Proper diapering can make a huge difference in the health, safety, and development of a young child. DDDR aims to help Native American, low-income, foster care and out of placement families/ children with this crucial element by providing eligible families with diapers and diapering supplies, as well as wraparound services.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- ◆ Native American Children from Low-Income Families
- ◆ Native American Children in Foster Care
- ◆ Native American Children Living Out of Placement (Such as homeless, displaced from immediate family, etc.)

## AVAILABLE SUPPORT SERVICES

**LIHEAP** assists low-income families in the Choctaw Nation with heating and cooling costs, including electricity, gas, propane and firewood.

**EMERGENCY SERVICES** assists tribal members with utility bills and rent/mortgage payments in the event of natural disasters, medical emergencies, loss of job and homelessness related to any of the previously mentioned conditions.

**KI BOIS** is a social service agency serving Southeastern Oklahoma through community programs, case management, transportation and more.

**TRANSPORTATION SERVICES** (Tribal Transit) offers patients transportation to non-emergency medical appointments at Choctaw Nation health facilities and specialized health clinics.

**WIC** is a supplemental nutrition program that provides formula, healthcare referrals and nutrition education for low-income pregnant or postpartum women and children up to age five. WIC is an equal opportunity program. Native and non-Native participants are welcome.

**AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING** is a Choctaw Nation program offering low-income families earning no more than 80% of the national median income.

**SNAP** helps low and no-income people purchase food to maintain adequate nutrition and health.

**CHOCTAW FOOD DISTRIBUTION** provides nutritious foods in eligible households within the Choctaw Nation and counties in Arkansas and Texas that border the Choctaw Nation.

**TRIBAL MEMBERSHIP** facilitates the process for establishing membership in the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma.

**CACFP** is a nutrition program that provides meals for children under 18 who visit one of the feeding sites in a congregate setting.

**NUTRITION SERVICES** helps navigate healthy eating practices to improve health and prevent disease.

**LIFT** is a community action agency providing services in prenatal care, resources for children, primary caregiver support, housing information and more.

**NEXT STEP** helps working households and elders learn necessary skills for achieving financial stability.

**ADULT EDUCATION** is an online academy for Native American students who did not finish high school and want to earn their High School Equivalency Diploma (GED).

**VOCATIONAL TRAINING** (VO-TECH or Career Development ) helps Native Americans get educational training through financial assistance and incentives for full-time training programs at Kiamichi Technology Centers.

**CAREER DEVELOPMENT** provides financial assistance for training, along with a variety of career guidance services, as well as workforce and academic skills development.

**CHOCTAW NATION VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM** offers services that assist Native American students with disabilities obtain gainful employment.

**HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAM** provides financial assistance to qualified Choctaw tribal members actively pursuing a higher education degree at an accredited college or university.

**HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT SERVICES** provides Choctaw students in grades 9-12 with academic information to promote education and/or a career path beyond high school.

**477 PROGRAM** provides a variety of services to employers and childcare providers including, but are not limited to, workforce planning, recruitment and assessment of potential employees.

**JOB FOR THE DAY** provides a temporary work program for tribal members who are looking to find a permanent job.

**COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING** provides services for tribal members in our rural communities to keep them healthy.

**CONNECTING KIDS TO COVERAGE** ensures qualifying children in Oklahoma have the medical coverage they deserve.

**INJURY PREVENTION PROGRAM/ CHILDREN MATTER (CAR SEAT PROGRAM)** focuses special attention on activities to prevent or reduce the occurrence of injuries to Native Americans within the Choctaw Nation service area.

**HEALTHY LIFESTYLES** promotes and hosts community events and advocates for policy changes that focus on physical activity, nutrition, tobacco prevention and overall healthy lifestyles.

**BEHAVIORAL HEALTH** provides a variety of mental health services for adults, adolescents, and children.

**WOMEN'S HEALTH CLINIC** provides care for all obstetrical patients, their unborn babies and a full range of gynecological care.

**PEDIATRIC SERVICES** provides health care to children and adolescents from newborn through 17 years of age.

**VISION AND HEARING SERVICES** provides eligible Choctaw tribal members with eyeglasses, dentures or partials and hearing aids.

**DENTAL SERVICES** provides annual exams, extractions, amalgam fillings, non-permanent stainless-steel crowns and hygiene services.

**RECOVERY CENTER** is a 60-day residential substance use disorder treatment facility with licensed and certified staff dedicated to providing quality substance use disorder treatment services.
